

## Introduction

Last year 444 people were killed on Victorian roads with many more seriously injured. The cost and impact of road trauma to the community is unacceptably high both in social and economic terms. Community involvement and participation is vital in reducing the toll.

The Saferoads Partnership, comprising representatives from VicRoads, Victoria Police, Transport Accident Commission, Municipal Association of Victoria, Local Government Professionals and RACV is proud to host the second Saferoads Road Safety Conference on Tuesday 16 & Wednesday 17 July 2002 at the Grand Hyatt, Melbourne.

Since the inception of the Saferoads partnership, 73 Victorian municipalities have been working to improve local road safety, through the development and implementation of local road safety strategies. The Saferoads initiative is an important element of *arrive alive!* Victoria's Road Safety Strategy 2002-2007, which aims to reduce the road toll by 20% over the next five years.

## Conference theme and objectives

The conference theme of 'Saferoads – turning plans into action' will bring together municipalities, community groups, road safety and research organisations to:

- promote good road safety practice in Victorian local government through increased knowledge, awareness and cooperation;
- highlight best practice in road safety and community programs through showcasing recent developments at a local, state, national and international level;
- promote a multi-discipline and partnership approach to making communities safer;
- provide local government and road safety practitioners with an opportunity to meet, network and learn from each others experience and knowledge in the field of road safety; and
- highlight the partnership approach to delivering Victoria's five year road safety strategy *arrive alive!*

## Keynote Speaker

Katherine Freund is President and Executive Director of the Independent Transportation Network (ITN), a community based, non-profit transportation service for seniors operating in Maine, USA. Funded as a model project by the Federal Transit Administration, the ITN has developed a transit solution for non-driving seniors that relies on user fees and voluntary community support to achieve economic sustainability. Communities in New York, Virginia and Maryland are currently planning ITN replications. An appropriation currently before the US Congress will take the ITN technology and business model to the Internet, making it available to communities across the United States and in other countries. Katherine has a Masters Degree in Public Policy from the Edmund S. Muskie School of Public Service and a Bachelors degree in English Literature from State University of New York at Buffalo. She is a National Transit Institute Fellow and a member of the Transportation Research Board's Committee on the Safe Mobility of Seniors.
