#### LETS START AT THE VERY BEGINNING

During a visit to Melbourne during February 1961, for the 5th test against the West Indies, two Tassie cricket enthusiasts, Harley Brooks of Ulverstone and Keith Hannan of Hobart, had discussions about a cricket match between the Tasmanian PWD (now DMR) and the Victorian Country Roads Board. As a result, a phone call was made to the CRB Head Office in Kew. The call was connected to a Mr. Bell, an official of the Social Club, who showed enthusiasm about the match taking place.

Upon return to Tasmania it was arranged for a letter to be forwarded to the CRB and eventually the first match was planned to be played at Ulverstone in Tasmania with the blessings of the then Director of Public Works, Mr. R. C. Sharp, and the Chairman of the Country Roads Board, Mr. D. V. Darwin. It was also arranged for tennis competitions to be played, with teams consisting of 4 men and 2 ladies.

The Tasmanian State Association was not in existence at that time so all arrangements for the games and social activities were carried out by officials from the Hobart and Ulverstone Sports and Social Clubs. They were Eric Free, Secretary, Keith Hannan, Treasurer, of Hobart, Len Pearce, President, Mel Good, Secretary, Jack Thompson, Dick Gadsby, Ross Glover, George Wilson and Dave Snare, Committeemen of Ulverstone.

The selectors for the cricket team were Len Pearce, Keith Hannan and Bob Cash of Launceston. Bob assisted greatly in the presentation of the team and the organisation of the match. Mr. L. Baily was District Engineer at Ulverstone in 1962 and, with his wife Lois, gave great support to the various functions held during the competitions.

The CRB party travelled to Devonport on Tuesday, 13th February, 1962 on the Princess of Tasmania (Bass Strait Ferry). The matches were played at Ulverstone on Wednesday and Thursday, 14th and 15th February. CRB won both contests easily.

Cricket scores were: CRB 267 - DMR 165 CRB won by 102 runs on the 1st Innings.

The Official Dinner was held at Stones Hotel, Ulverstone on Wednesday, 14th February, 1962, with the Toast Master being the then PWD Plant Engineer - Mr. M. R. Read.

The next matches were played in Melbourne in 1963 and have been played alternately in Tasmania and Melbourne on an annual basis ever since. Golf replaced tennis in the competitions in 1967.

Several members of both the 1962 cricket teams deserve special mention. For the CRB the Captain was Noel Allanson, a well known Essendon cricketer and footballer. Noel is currently a Board Member of the Country Roads Board and never fails to meet members of the DMR party when they visit Melbourne. Graeme Deany is the only Victorian from that match who played in 1981. Max Palmer was a stalwart until he transferred to Hong Kong. Jim Webber and Bill Saggers were great competitors over a number of years. The CRB umpire, Les Holt, was a very popular person with both parties and officiated for many years. Of the Tasmanians, Bob Peters and Trevor Quilliam continued playing through to 1981, although not continuously. Doug White has given 21 years of sterling service as player, selector and manager. Les Wootten, Len Pearce (Captain) and John Oxley performed with distinction for many years.

#### THE TROPHY DONORS

#### F. F. FORD - MEMORIAL SHIELD FOR CRICKET

Mr. "Pat" Ford was well known throughout the State of Tasmania as Chief Engineer of the then Department of Public Works during the period 1954-64. Pat was a great supporter of sport and social activities within the three districts and until his retirement he always enjoyed attending the interstate competitions. There was always a card game arranged between the big betters of the teams and Pat enjoyed these immensely.

#### F. N. LAKIN - CUP FOR TENNIS

Mr. Fred Lakin was the donor of the trophy for tennis competition which unfortunately lasted for only five years. Fred has given great support and encouragement to the organisation of the competitions throughout the 21 years. It would be true to say that without Fred's backing the Sports and Social Clubs within the Department of Main Roads would not be as strong and active as they are at present. This has had a considerable influence on the success of the CRB/DMR sporting competitions.

#### F. WEST - TROPHY FOR GOLF

Mr. Frank West donated a trophy for golf competition when tennis ceased to be played. Frank was a Board Member of the Country Roads Board during the period 1963-68. He was also a keen golfer and his wisdom in sponsoring golf competition between the two bodies has been justified by the keenness of the matches played and the number of sincere friendships that have emerged during the last 14 years.


