
The cadet and a surety will be required to enter into an agreement that he will not discontinue the course without the Board's approval, and will remain in the Board's service after the completion of the course for a period equal to the length of time he has been supported at the University plus an additional year. This agreement also provides that in the event of failure to complete the course, University fees and living allowances paid to the cadet will be refunded to the Board.
